Gentlemen:

Pursuant to your request, a resolution was presented to the Town Council of Irvington at its regular meeting on Thursday, April 11th, which resolution was propared by the Commonwealths Attorney and provided for the complete relignishment by the Town of Irvington of its rights to tax automobiles. This resolution was fully discussed and was deferred until a special meeting of the Council on Saturday, April15th, when it was again presented and discussed. After much deliberation, the resolution was defeated.

The reasons for the defeat of this resolution were many. The Council felt that once it relinquished its rights to tax automobiles in Irvington, it would never have the right again. Further, it is the only tax imposed uppn the people of Irvington and, consequently, is one of the few sources of revenue the Town has. The opinion was further expressed that if the Board of Supervisors did feel that it could require the people of Lancaster County to purchase auto tags at \$10.00 each because of the fact that the tax would not be uniform throughout the County, the Town of Irvington, in order to make it uniform, would increase its Town automobile license to \$10.00 to correspond with the County license.

The Council of Irvington feels that this matter could have been worked out satisfactorily had all the Towns been contacted when the matter first came up, but due to the many conflicting proposals advanced to them , the Council never was quite sure exactly what the Board of Supervisors expected of them. The Town of Irvington still stands ready to work out any reasonable plan whereby automobiles in Lancaster County may be taxed uniformly, but it does not feel that at this time, it can unequivocably relinquish its automobile lincense tags.

Time Shan Ministurther feels that an additional thirty cent real estate lever for future school construction is unwise at this time, and hopes that the Board of Supervisors will not see fit to increase the real estate levy above its present rate.

The Council deems it advisable the Board be requested not to adopt a levy for the purpose of creating a school sinking fund or fund for meture school construction until a definite and comprehensive plan for building as to time and place has been presentd and ad op ted by the School Board.

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AN ORDINANCE GRANTING A FRANCHISE TO THE TIDEWATER TELEPHONE COMPANY, A COMPANY INCORPORATED UNDER THE LAWS OF VIRGINIA WITH ITS PRINCIPAL OFFICE AT WARSAW, VIRGINIA, ITS SUCCESSORS AND ASSIGNS, TO USE THE STREETS AND OTHER PUBLIC PLACES OF THE TOWN OF IRVINGTON, VIRGINIA, FOR ITS POLES, WIRES, CONDUITS, CABLES AND FIXTURES.

WHEREAS a proposed ordinance, entitled, "AN ORDINANCE GRANTING A FRANCHISE TO TIDEWATER TELEPHONE COMPANY, ITS SUC-CESSORS AND ASSIGNS, TO USE THE STREETS AND OTHER PUBLIC PLACES OF THE TOWN OF IRVINGTON, VIRGINIA, FOR ITS POLES, WIRES, CON-DUITS, CABLES AND FIXTURES", was ordered to be advertised by the Council of the Town of Irvington, after its terms had been approved by the Mayor; and

WHEREAS the terms of said ordinance were approved by the Mayor and the same has been published once a week for four successive weeks in a newspaper having general circulation in said Town of Irvington, no newspaper being published therein, which said advertisement invited bids for the franchise proposed to be granted in said ordinance, said bids to be in writing and delivered upon the day and hour named in said advertisement to the presiding officer of the Council, in open session: and reported in favor of accepting said bid and adopting said ordinance;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF IRVINGTON, LANCASTER COUNTY, VIRGINIA, that TIDEWATER TELEPHONE COMPANY, its successors and assigns, for a period of Thirty (30) years be and is hereby authorized and empowered to construct, maintain and operate its posts, poles, conduits, manholes, ducts, cables, wires and all other necessary overhead and underground apparatus on, over, along, in, under and through the streets, alleys, highways and other public places within the limits of the Town of Irvington, in the County of Lancaster, State of Virginia, and to use the property of other companies and permit other companies to use its property upon such arrangements as the two companies may agree; PROVIDED:

SECTION 1. That all poles erected by said Company shall be neat and symmetrical, and shall be so located as in no way to interfere with the safety or convenience of persons traveling on or over the said streets, alleys, highways and other public places; and in the installation and maintenance of its underground system, said Company shall not open or encumber more of any street, alley, highway or other public place than will be necessary to enable it to perform the work with proper economy and efficiency.

SECTION 2. That the erection of poles and construction of conduits under the provisions of this ordinance shall be

said wires are placed and maintained in such a manner as may be prescribed by the said Company, and in no case used to carry electric light or high-tension currents.

SECTION 4. That the said Company shall maintain its lines in good and safe order and condition; and shall at all times fully indemnify, protect and save harmless the said Town from and against all claims arising from the erection, construction or negligent maintenance of its said lines.

SECTION 5. That nothing in this ordinance shall be construed to grant unto the said Company any exclusive right or to prevent a grant of similar privileges to other companies.

SECTION 6. This ordinance shall be in force from its passage.

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED that TIDEWATER TELEPHONE COMPANY, before proceeding to act under this ordinance, shall execute a bond, in the penalty of <u>One theorem and "y've dellars</u> ($\frac{1}{2000}$) with good and sufficient security, in favor of the Town of Irvington, conditioned upon the construction and putting into operation and maintaining in good order, the plant provided for in this franchise, and the furnishing of efficient telephone service at reasonable rates.
