## **TOWN OF IRVINGTON**

At a Regular Meeting of the Council of the Town of Irvington held on Thursday, June 9, 1960 at 8:00 O'clock P.M. the following resolution was passed.

Be it resolved by the Town Council of Irvington that the Department of Highways be requested to add to the Secondary System of Highways the following street within the Corporate limits of the Town of Irvington.

Route # 635 beginning at the end of present maintenance which is 1434 feet or 0.27 mile South of intersection Route # 3 and continuing in a Southerly direction a distance of 1320 feet or 0.25 mile to end of maintenance. This road was a part of the Secondary System of Lancaster County prior to the Town of Irvington being incorporated on August 2, 1955. A forty foot right-of-way had been acquired for construction of curb and gutter project which consist of 816 feet of the above described street. There is no recorded data showing dedication of the balance of the 504 feet of above described street.

The Town Council of Irvington guarantees a 40 foot clear unrestricted right-of-way for 816 feet of the above described street (curb and gutter section), also guarantees a 30 foot clear unrestricted right-of-way for 504 feet of the above described street to be added to the Secondary System of Lancaster County.

TOWN OF IRVINGTON

At a regular meeting of the Council of the Town of Irvington held on Thursday, June 9, 1933 at 8:00 o'clock P.M., the following resolution was passed.

Be it resolved by the Town Council of Irvington that the Department of Highways be requested to add to the Secondary System of Highways the following street within the Corporate limits of the Town of Irvington.

Route # 333 beginning at the end of present maintenance which is 1434 feet or 0.37 mile South of intersection Route # 3 and continuing in a southerly direction a distance of 1210 feet or 0.23 mile to end of maintenance. This road was a part of the Secondary System of Lancaster County prior to the Town of Irvington being incorporated on August 2, 1933. A forty foot right-of-way had been acquired for construction of curb and gutter project which consist of 610 feet of the above described street. There is no recorded data showing dedication of the balance of the 304 feet of above described street.

The Town Council of Irvington guarantees a 40 foot clear unrestricted right-of-way for 610 feet of the above described street (curb and gutter section). Also guarantees a 30 foot clear unrestricted right-of-way for 304 feet of the above described street to be added to the Secondary System of Lancaster County.





These representatives appeared before Members of the Council requesting that the Town have sand and gravel put on road leading from Main Road to Community Building.

Upon motion by Mr. Jones and seconded by Mr. Lokey, it was agreed that the town would pay the cost of repairing road as requested.

Mayor Haynie instructed the Clerk to read the minutes of the regular meeting held October 13, 1960. These minutes were approved as read.

It is further understood that Council reserves the right to revoke this privilege should the building or its contents be disturbed during these meetings.

Upon motion by Mr. Donahue and Mr. Turlington, it was decided to have stove at the Library cleaned and repaired.

There was some discussion regarding the placing of a stop sign at road leading from property of Mayor Haynie and others.

There was also some discussion about securing additional book shelves for the Library.


No action was taken on either of these matters at this meeting.

The Mayor next brought before the Council for discussion the proposed improvements for Route 634 in the Town of Irvington. After some discussion, the following resolution made by W. A. Jones, Sr. and seconded by David Willing, was unanimously approved:

"Resolved: That the Town of Irvington advise the Department of Highways of the Commonwealth of Virginia of its approval of Project #1351-06 providing for the improvement of Virginia State Highway Route #634 through the Town of Irvington extending from the intersection with Route 3 in Irvington in a westerly and southerly direction to the intersection of Route 633 and further that the Town of Irvington guarantee title and a right of way 53 feet in width from the intersection of Route 3 in a westerly direction to the intersection of Route 672 and that it further guarantee the title and a right of way 41 feet wide from the intersection of Route 672 in a southerly direction to the intersection of Route 633 as shown on plans of said project, approved August 22, 1957, and revised November 22, 1960, and that the Department of Highways further be requested to commence the said project as soon as possible and that the Town take the necessary steps to obtain title to land included in the right of way that has not previously been obtained by deed, said title to be obtained by deed or condemnation. The Town further agrees to save the Commonwealth of Virginia, her officials and employees harmless from any and all claims for damages that may arise as a result of the acquisition and clearance of the right of way or incident to the completion of the aforesaid project #1351-06.
