Mayor Haynie called the meeting to order and introduced Mr. and Mrs. James Bromley.

Mrs. Bromley entered a complaint about water drainage in front of their property.

Mayor Haynie advised Mrs. Bromley that the Highway Department would be notified and requested to make necessary repairs.

Mayor Haynie requested the reading of the minutes of the meeting held January 9, 1964. These minutes were approved as read.

Upon motion by Mr. Lokey and seconded by Mr. Gaskins it was agreed to raise the salary of Sergeant Shelton to \$75.00 per month as of January 1, 1964. It was also agreed that the town of Irvington would pay all of Mr. Shelton's Social Security tax. It was further agreed that this motion also rescinds a prior resolution to allow Mr. Shelton five gallons of gasoline per week.

Sheriff Robert Mason appeared before Council and explained about the radio hook-up with the County base station and the advantages of having constant contact with all law enforcement officers.

Mr. Mason stated that the cost would be approximately \$615.00 installed.

There was some discussion about the insurance program for town officers.

Mr. Mason made some suggestions about printing town warrants.

The treasurer reported a balance of \$11,403.55 as of January 31, 1964.

Upon motion by Mr. Lokey and seconded by Mr. Donahue it was agreed to reimburse the petty cash fund \$25.00.

Mr. Turlington made a motion which was seconded by Mr. Gaskins authorizing the installation of a two-way radio in Sergeant Shelton's car.

Motion carried.

Upon motion by Mr. Lokey and seconded by Mr. Donahue it was decided to purchase two pairs of summer trousers and two shirts and a cap cover for the Sergeant's uniform.

Mayor Haynie called the meeting to order and instructed the clerk to read the minutes of the meeting held March 18, 1964. These minutes were approved as read.



The treasurer reported a balance of \$10,832.59 of March 31, 1964.

Mrs. Barrack stated that some years ago a fund had been started to set up a memorial for Mrs. Mary L. Whaley to commemorate her years of faithful service as librarian. Mrs. Barrack informed the Council that it was the desire of the committee to purchase a set of World Book Encyclopedia to be placed in the library and requested Council to furnish the funds necessary to supplement the money now on hand in order to make this purchase.

Upon motion by Mr. Turlington and seconded by Mr. Gaskins the Treasurer was authorized to pay the additional funds necessary to purchase a set of the encyclopedia to be placed in the library.

Minutes of the meeting held April 9, 1964 were approved as read.

The Treasurer reported a balance of \$10,612.09 as of April 30, 1964.

Sergeant Shelton appeared before Council and advised its members that there were several provisions in the Code of Irvington which do not provide for a penalty for many offences and will not stand in court.

Mr. Lokey suggested that Mr. Foster be invited to the next Council meeting to discuss any changes or remedies which can be made to correct the present Code.

Mr. Lokey reported that Mr. Marion Reynolds had requested that some action be taken to find what can be done about shrubbery obstructing the view of the main highway at corner of road leading from Irvington Boat Basin. It was decided that the town has no authority in this matter.

Mayor Haynie called the meeting to order and instructed the clerk to read the minutes of the meeting held May 14, 1964. These minutes were approved as read.

Mr. Donahue made a motion which was seconded by Mr. Gaskins that Council provide \$41.80 to purchase recreation equipment for the children of the town.

Motion carried.

The treasurer reported a balance of \$11,870.02 as of May 29, 1964.

Mayor Haynie reported that Mr. McBroom has started the proceedings to change the speed limit signs within the corporate limits of Irvington.

Mayor Haynie read a letter from the Highway Department regarding the construction of a new bridge on route #3, leading from Irvington to White Stone.

Upon motion by Mr. Donahue and seconded by Mr. Gaskins it was decided to pay election judges \$10.00 each.

Mr. Gaskins made a motion which was seconded by Mr. Donahue granting permission to the Tides Inn to use fireworks on the night of July 4, 1964.

Mr. Foster reported that the cost to transfer title to the recreation property to the Town of Irvington would be \$100.00 plus expenses.

Upon motion by Mr. Lokey and seconded by Mr. Donahue, Mr. Foster was authorized to take any action necessary to transfer title to the above named property.

Mr. Foster met with members of Council and reported on various changes needed in the Town Code.

Upon motion by Mr. Lokey and seconded by Mr. Donahue, the following resolution was unanimously adopted.

RESOLVED: That the Town of Irvington hereby specifically requests the Commonwealth of Virginia, acting through the Highway Department, to take over for maintenance one-quarter of a mile of road commencing at Virginia State Highway No. 715 at the northeast corner of the land in the Town of Irvington known as the Community Center and extending in a northwesterly and a northeasterly direction adjacent to the Town of Irvington property and following the present roadway leading into the property of Franklin D. Henderson and others for a distance of one-quarter of a mile. That further the Town of Irvington does represent that it has authority to grant the land involved for the additional road by virtue of a deed from Franklin D. Henderson and others to the Town of Irvington, which deed is of record in the Clerk's Office of the Circuit Court of Lancaster County, Virginia, in Deed Book 136 at Page 556.

Upon motion by Mr. Lokey and seconded by Mr. Donahue the following amendments and new ordinances were adopted as emergency measures, after their first reading.

Section 8-22 of the Code of the Town of Irvington is hereby repealed and the following ordinance is hereby adopted in lieu thereof.

Section 8-22. Compliance with chapter; penalty for violation of Chapter 7.

It shall be unlawful for any person to refuse, fail or neglect to comply with any of the provisions of this chapter or any rule or regulation promulgated pursuant thereto, and any such violation shall constitute a misdemeanor.

Every person convicted of a misdemeanor for a violation of any of the provisions of this chapter or rule or regulation promulgated pursuant thereto, for which no other penalty is provided shall, for a first conviction thereof, be punished by a fine of not more than \$100.00 or by imprisonment in jail for not more than ten days or by both such fine and imprisonment; for a second such conviction within one year such person shall be punished by a fine of not less than ten dollars nor more than two hundred dollars or by imprisonment in jail for not less than one nor more than twenty days, or by both such fine and imprisonment; for a third or subsequent conviction within one year such person shall be punished by a fine of not less than twenty-five dollars nor more than five hundred dollars or by imprisonment in jail for not less than ten days nor more than six months, or by both such fine and imprisonment.

7. For state law prohibiting counties, cities and towns from imposing a penalty for violations of traffic ordinances in excess of that imposed for a similar offense by the state, see Code of Va., 46.1-180. For state law as to penalty for violation of motor vehicle and traffic regulations generally, see Code of Va. 46.1-16

This ordinance adopted as an emergency measure and shall take effect immediately upon adoption.



The following ordinance is hereby adopted and made a part of the Code of the Town of Irvington.

Section 8-29.1. Driving without licenses prohibited

A. No person, except those expressly exempted by statute, shall drive any motor vehicle on any highway or street in this Town until such person shall have made application for an operator's or chauffeur's license as required by law and satisfactorily passed the examination required and obtained either an operator's or chauffeur's license, unless such person shall have been issued an operator's or chauffeur's license prior to June 19, 1946, that is renewable in the discretion of the Division of Motor Vehicles.

B. Any person violating this section upon conviction shall be punished by a fine of not more than five hundred dollars or by imprisonment of not more than six months, or by both such fine and imprisonment.

This ordinance adopted as an emergency measure, and shall take effect immediately upon adoption.

The following ordinance is hereby adopted as a part of the Code of the Town of Irvington to be designated as Section 8-29.2.

Section 8-29.2. Driving while license suspended or revoked.

A. No person, resident or non-resident, whose operator's or chauffeur's license or instruction permit has been suspended or revoked by any Court or by the Commissioner of Motor Vehicles or by operation of law, or who has been forbidden as prescribed by law by the Commissioner, the State Corporation Commission, the State Highway Commissioner, or the Superintendent of State Police, to operate a motor vehicle in the State of Virginia shall thereafter drive any motor vehicle in this Town unless and until the period of such suspension or revocation shall have terminated.

B. Any person violating this section shall for the first offense be confined in jail not less than ten days nor more than six months; and may in addition be fined not less than fifty dollars nor more than one hundred dollars; and for the second or any subsequent offense be confined in jail not less than two months nor more than one year; and may in addition be fined not less than one hundred dollars nor more than one thousand dollars.

This ordinance adopted as an emergency measure and shall take effect immediately upon adoption.

Section 3-38 of the Code of the Town of Irvington as adopted in 1961 is hereby repealed and the following ordinance is hereby adopted in lieu thereof.

Section 3-38. Code--Penalty for reckless driving.

Every person convicted of reckless driving under sections 3-33 through 3-37 shall, for the first violation, be punished by a fine not exceeding \$500.00 or confinement in jail not exceeding twelve months in discretion of the jury or the Court trying the case without a jury. For each second or subsequent conviction for the offense of reckless driving, under any of said sections, committed within twelve months before or after the date of another act of reckless driving for which he has not been convicted, such person shall be punished by a fine of not less than \$100.00, nor more than \$500.00 or by imprisonment in jail for not less than ten days nor more than twelve months, or by both such fine and imprisonment.

Except in those cases for which revocation of license is provided under Code of Virginia, paragraph (e) of section 46.1-417, the court may, in addition to the foregoing punishment, suspend any license issued to such convicted person under Chapter 5 of Title 46.1 of the Code of Virginia, for a period of not less than ten days nor more than six months and the court shall require such convicted person to surrender his license so suspended. If such person so convicted has not obtained the license required by such chapter, the court may direct in the judgment of conviction that such person shall not for such period of not less than ten days nor more than six months as may be prescribed in the judgment, drive or operate any motor vehicle in this state.

The court or the clerk of such court shall transmit such license to the commissioner along with the report of such conviction required to be sent to the division.

This ordinance adopted as an emergency measure and shall take effect immediately upon adoption.

Henderson and others and following the center line of said road for a distance of one-quarter of a mile. That further the Town of Irvington does represent that it has authority to grant the land involved for the additional road by virtue of a deed from Franklin D. Henderson and others to the Town of Irvington, dated June 16, 1964, which deed is of record in the Clerk's Office of the Circuit Court of Lancaster County, Virginia, in Deed Book 136 at Page 556.

Mr. Foster met with members of Council to check the approved plans for a new bridge to be constructed on the Irvington-White Stone road.


Mr. Gaskins made a motion which was seconded by Mr. Burke to fix salaries for all paid personnel at the same level as paid in 1963.

Mrs. Fleet also asked for information regarding the construction of a new Community Building. Mr. Simmons suggested that this might be accomplished by a fund raising drive and have individuals to underwrite the project.

Siguard Solem requested plans for future roads to comply with zoning laws.

Mayor Turlington instructed the clerk to read the minutes of the meeting held October 8, 1964. These minutes were approved as read.

The treasurer reported a balance of \$12,062.62 as of October 31, 1964.

Mr. Lokey read the deed conveying the school property to the Town of Irvington.



Upon motion by Mr. Lokey and seconded by Mr. Mitchell the treasurer was authorized to pay all current bills including legal expenses for transferring deed to school property.

Mayor Turlington read a letter from the Library Board requesting that \$200.00 be set up in the budget for new books, and further requested that the salary for the Librarian be set at the same level as of 1964.

"Except in defense of life, limb, or property or in the extermination of pests or predators."
