Henderson and others for a distance of one-quarter of a mile. That further the Town of Irvington does represent that it has authority to grant the land involved for the additional road by virtue of a deed from Franklin D. Henderson and others to the Town of Irvington, which deed is of record in the Clerk's Office of the Circuit Court of Lancaster County, Virginia, in Deed Book 136 at Page 556.

Upon motion by Mr. Lokey and seconded by Mr. Donahue the following amendments and new ordinances were adopted as emergency measures, after their first reading.

Section 8-22 of the Code of the Town of Irvington is hereby repealed and the following ordinance is hereby adopted in lieu thereof.

# Section 8-22. Compliance with chapter; penalty for violation of Chapter 7.

It shall be unlawful for any person to refuse, fail or neglect to comply with any of the provisions of this chapter or any rule or regulation promulgated pursuant thereto, and any such violation shall constitute a misdere enor.

Every person convicted of a misdemeaner for a violation of any of the provisions of this chapter or rule or regulation promulgated pursuant thereto, for which no other penalty is provided shall, for a first conviction thereof, be punished by a fine of not more than (100.00 or b) imprisonment in jail for not more than ten days or by both such fine and imprisonment; for a second such conviction within one year such person shall be punished by a fine of not less than ten deltars nor more than two hundred dollars or by imprisonment in jail for not less than one nor more than twenty days, or by both such fine and imprisonment; for a third or subsequent conviction within one year such person shall be punished by a fine of not less than therefyfive dollars nor more than is not more than two hundred the and imprisonment; for a third or subsequent conviction within one year such person shall be punished by a fine of not less than therefyfive dollars nor more than five hundred dollars or by imprisonment in jail for not less than ten days nor more than six months, or by both such fine and imprisonment.

> 7. For state law prohibiting counties, cities and towns from imposing a penalty for violations of traffic ordinances in excess of that imposed for a similar offense by the state, see Code of Wa., 46.1-180. For state law as to penalty for violation of motor wehicle and traffic regulations generally, see Code of Wa. 46.1-16

This ordinance adopted as an emorgency measure and shall take effect inmodiately upon adoption.

## Section 8-29.1. Driving without licenses rohibited

A. He person, except those expressly excepted by atdute, shall duive any motor vehicle on any highway or streat in this "form until such person shall have made application for an operator's or chauffeur's license" as required by law and satisfactorily passed the examination required and obtained either an operator's or chauffeur's license, unless such person shall have been issued an operator's or chauffeur's license prior to June 19, 1946, that is renewable in the discretion of the Division of Motor Vehicles.

B. Any person violating this section upon conviction shall be punished by a fine of not more than five hundred dollars or by imprisonment of not more than six months, or by both such fine and imprisonment.

This ordinance adopted as an emergency measure, and shall take effect immediately upon adoption.

The following ordinance is hereby adopted as a part of the Code of the Town of Invington to be designated as Section 8-29.2.

## Section 8-29.2. Driving while license suspended or revolud.

A. No person, realdent or non-reaident, whose operator's or chauffeur's license or instruction permit has been suspended or revolved by any Court or by the Cocalesticher of Motor Vehicles or by operation of law or the has been forblidden as preseribed by law by the Completioner, the State Corporation Commission, the State Highway Commissioner, or the Superintendent of State Police, to operate a motor vehicle in the State of Vinginia shall thereafter drive ony motor vehicle in this Town unless and until the period of such suspension or revocation shall have terminated.

B. Any person violating this section shall for the first offerse be confined in juil not less than ten days nor more than six months; and may in addition be fired not less than fifty dollars nor more than one hundred dollars; and for the second or any subsequent offense be confined in juil not less than two months nor more than one year; and may in addition be fined not less than one hundred dollars nor more than one thousand dollars.

This ordinance adopted as an everyona, measure and shall take effect immediately upon adoption.

Section 2-32 of the Gode of the Town of Irvington as adopted in 1961 is hereby repealed and the following ordinance is larel, adopted in lieu thereof.

#### <u> Sention 2-38. Some--Penelty for meriless Crivity</u>

Every person convicted of reckless driving under soctions 8-33 "lirough 8-37 shall, for the first violation, be panished by a fire not exceeding 500.00 or confinement in jail not exceeding twelve months in discretion of the jury or the Court trying the case without a jury. For each second or subsequent conviction for the offense of reckless driving, under say of said sections, conmitted within trelve months before or after the date of another set of reckless driving for thich he has not been convicted, such person shall be puriched by a first of not less than 100.00, nor more than 500.00 or by imprisonment in jail for not less than ten days nor more than twelve months, or by both such first and imprisonment.

Except in those capes for which reveabler of ligence is provided under Code of Virginia, parsgraph (c) of section 46.1-417, the court may, in addition to the foregoing punisheaut, suspend on discuss the cuch convicted parson under Sampter 5 of Title 46.1 of the Code of Virginia, for a period of not been than ten days nor more than six months and the court shall require such convicted person to surreader his licence to suspended. If such person to convicted has not obtained the licence to suspended. If such person to convicted has not obtained the licence required by Such chapter, the court may direct in the judgment of conviction that such person that not for such period of not less than ten days nor more than six months as may be preseribed in the judgment, drive or operated any motor vehicle in this state.

Upon motion by Mr. A. G. Lokey and seconded by Miss Flora Lokey the amendment to Section 9-14. Firearms Discharging, of the Code of the Town of Irvington, was adopted after its second reading.

Mr. Donahue was authorized to contact another electrician or order to have the Christmas Tree lighted.

Upon proper motion meeting adjourned.
