
McGinnes reported he had gotten the perk test on the Thomas property and it does perk. Mr Marsh and Mr G.C. Dawson will give another appraisal on property.



WHEREAS, Lancaster County has agreed to accept the lead in local administration of the contractor which has been selected to carry the study out, namely, Dewberry, Nealon, & Davis, and

WHEREAS, the contractor has asked for a committee to serve as representatives of the various political subdivisions involved,

Be it Therefore Resolved

THAT the Town Council of Irvington acknowledges that it is a party to the State Water Control Board Designated 201 Study Area for the Carters Creek Drainage Basin,

THAT the Town Council hereby reaffirms its financial support to the extent of \$1,640 for this purpose,

THAT Marion Reynolds is hereby designated as the representative of the Town of Irvington on the committee to serve as advisor to the contractor, and Jack Garrett is hereby designated as alternate member of the committee, and

THAT the Irvington Town Council reserves the right to approve or reject alternative solutions to improve water quality in the Carters Creek Basin, if water quality improvement is needed, subject to completion of the study and public hearings on the Facilities Plan.

RESOLUTION OF IRVINGTON TOWN COUNCIL

WHEREAS, the Lancaster County Board of Supervisors is considering a proposal to consolidate the voting precincts in Lancaster County into three polling places, one in each district, and

WHEREAS, such a consolidation would require all of the citizens of Irvington to travel a longer distance to cast their ballots, and

WHEREAS, this increased travel would be more costly in terms of time and energy resources, which so clearly need to be conserved, and

WHEREAS, many of the citizens of Irvington are elderly and many are dependent upon friends and relatives for transportation, and

WHEREAS, Irvington citizens have a record of substantially above average voter turnout, as compared with the state and national average, and

WHEREAS, it is reasonable to assume that the increased inconvenience of the proposed consolidation of voting places as well as personal cost, would reduce the Irvington voter turnout, resulting in a detriment to the Democratic process, and

BE IT THEREFORE RESOLVED, after due discussion and consideration of the proposed consolidation, that the Irvington Town Council at its regular meeting on March 10, 1977 strongly opposes the proposed consolidation of voting places in the County and hereby urges the Lancaster County Board of Supervisors to reject the proposal.


After some discussion on trash pick up it was decided to have Doggett Bros. the other cans will be picked up later in the summer.
